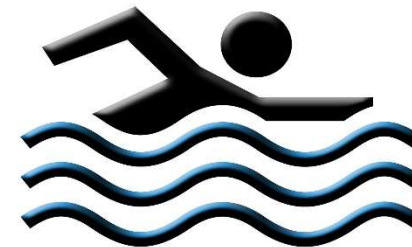

<b>Key achievements to date:</b>	<b>Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:</b>
<p>The link between our school and the PCSA cluster continues to strengthen with additional opportunities for sport being available. This year cluster festivals have included the Early Year Foundation stage.</p> <p>Participation at the Torbay Dance festival.</p> <p>Increased swimming provision in all year groups. The children benefit greatly from their swimming sessions as they are able to gain water confidence and many children take up swimming outside of school.</p> <p>Employment of an activity MTA to support Y6 Play Leaders. Play leaders trained and new equipment purchased following consultation with school council.</p> <p>An increase in the number of active after school clubs.</p>	<p>Summer term sessions (Year 1 and Year 5) were interrupted by Covid-19 so they will take priority if swimming is able to re-commence.</p> <p>Dance CPD Summer term sessions (Year 3 and Year 1) were interrupted by Covid-19.</p> <p>Extra-curricular clubs postponed from March 2020 due to covid-19. Find ways to work around the bubble restrictions/staggered days to allow for extra-curricular sessions to continue. To work more closely with KSG over 20-21. KSG to run after school provision in a wider variety of sports such as archery and handball.</p> <p>KSG staff to train MTAs in active playground activities.</p> <p>An active water-sports week in Brixham was planned for Y5 during summer 1 which was cancelled due to covid.</p> <p>Due to restrictions on trips this year, facilities in the school playground to improve: fixed equipment/markings.</p> <p>Safe storage for bikes/scooters to encourage cycling/scooting to school.</p> <p>Explore the self-rescue element of swimming and ensure it taught and assessed within KS2</p>
