What a busy week it has been as Sacred Heart continues to get out and about into the wider world.



On Monday, Year 4 were lucky enough to set off on a free trip to PGL. As we have a long-standing partnership with PGL we were one of only two schools in the South offered West this amazing opportunity to trial their new initiative, 'Pioneers' an activity holiday for younger children. The children were able to experience many new things from the ordinary (carrying their own bags/sleeping away from home/trying new foods) the extra ordinary

(zipwires/aeroball/campfires). The group faced their fears and pushed themselves to meet their self-made targets. I was astonished by the perseverance of some of the children; they just wouldn't give up. Thank you to Mrs Nott, Mrs McCaig and Miss Shaw for giving up their time to make this happen and for the continuous care you gave to the children to make the experience super special for them.

On Wednesday, Year 3 visited Dartmoor as part of their geography-based Enquiry Project, 'National Parks' where they discovered the remains of prehistoric roundhouses, used their enquiry skills to be history detectives and find out what was buried in the cairns and guessed the reasons that stone



rows were constructed. They also used their science knowledge as they identified igneous rocks and after a trip to the visitor centre, they also reflected on why Dartmoor was such an important National Park and why it should be conserved into the future.



Year 2 have had two adventures this week. Yesterday they were the first class to attend Paignton Academy (PA) for the Paignton Primary School's Tag Rugby festival. The festivals are arranged by PA involving six local primary schools. It is a great opportunity for competitive sports and to put the skills being learned in PE lessons in school into practice. Once again, you were great ambassadors for Sacred Heart with great sportsmanship and attitude. At the time of writing, Year 2 are in Brixham finding out more about Sir Francis Drake and The Golden Hind.

We had a lot of food left over from the Harvest Mass which the Pupil Chaplains set out on a stall and offered for purchase at the end of the day in exchange for a small donation. If your child was born between 1st September 2010 and 31st August 2011 you will soon need to apply for a secondary school place.

The application period is open from 1 September 2021 until 31st October 2021.

## How do I apply?

The preferred method of application is online via the Citizen's Portal. This can be found at www.torbay.gov.uk/schools-and-learning/admissions/secondary-place-2022/
 The portal will open on 1st September and will close at 23.59pm on 31st October 2021.
 Late applications, those made after this time, will be at a disadvantage.

## **School Lunches**



# **Important**

The system you use to make payments to school has changed its name. SIMS Pay is now known as Pay360 Education Payments.

- The way you make payments will remain the same you'll just notice a different logo (Pay360 by Capita) on the login page and in the portal.
- The link to log in will be updated to pay360educationpayments.com
- When you make a payment, you'll notice the details on your card statement will show as 'Pay360\*school\_name' (rather than 'Capita\*school\_name').
- We would recommend that you add the new email address noreply@pay360educationpayments.com to your contacts/whitelist to ensure the emails are not marked as spam

# Remember your child's school lunch needs to be ordered on Pay360 for the week ahead, by the Saturday before.

- Children in Reception Class, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals however you still need to order your child's school lunch on the Sims Pay system.
- If your child/ren is/are entitled to benefit-related Free School Meals, their school lunch also needs to be ordered on the Sims Pay system
- All school meals MUST be paid for (if applicable) at the time of ordering so that no debt is incurred.

#### School Crossing Patrol for Sacred Heart R C Primary School ~ Cecil Road

Unfortunately, the School Crossing Patrol on Cecil Road will not be returning so we are looking to recruit someone who would like to take on this worthwhile and rewarding role.

The times for this site are: **0830–0915** (45 mins) and **1445-1530** (45 mins) = 1 hour 30 minutes each day, which includes 5 minutes setting up time, either side of the patrol duty.

The starting pay rate is £9.24 per hour, which is approximately £3000 per year equating to £250 per month (over 12 months).

We will provide everything in the way of uniform, training and support - no special experience or qualifications are necessary, although clearance with the Disclosure and Barring Service (previously CRB) will be required and which we will pay for.

Do you know someone who might like to take on this very rewarding role - what about a relative or neighbour who lives in the area? It really is one of the most rewarding part-time jobs!

### What about the Tooth Fairy? Elys Dolan


